The wine will remain a "mystery" until presented, and cherry-picking from the Bin is not allowed. As an indication of the level of caliber of the Bin wines here are a few examples of the goodies we found recently: Freemark Abbey Bousche, Franciscan Magnificat, and Flowers Pinot Noir.

Blending is a common practice in winemaking, with myriad reasons for doing so. For some winemakers, blending would create a more complex wine from the interplay of unique taste profiles from different grapes. On the other hand, some blend because of economic purposes, because wineries do not want to lose an entire vintage from say, a bad crop of Cabernet while Merlot could have been viable. Yet for some blending is way to chart a new course in winemaking and bucking long-established traditions.

Regardless of the specific reason(s), the art of blending has a rich tradition in the history of winemaking, and is widely practiced in both the New and the Old worlds. Here's a rotating feature of some interesting blends:

Les Champs de l'Abbaye 2005 Bourgogne-Passetoutgrain Burgundy 49

While it is widely known that Red Burgundy is Pinot Noir, in the appellation of Bourgogne-Passetoutgrain they blend Pinot Noir with Gamay, the other regional grape. Gamay is used for making the famous Beaujolais Nouveau, and the juicy, fresh fruit character of the grape is evident in this blend.

Mas Doix "Salanques" 2005 Grenache/Carignon Blend 91

Many traditional Spanish bottlings are also blends. In the up-and-coming region of Priorat, Grenache and Carignon dominate. These hearty vines can often reach 100 plus years of age. Priorat blends are robust and strong, and could rival some of the heaviest Napa Cabernet.

Stolpman "La Croce" 2003 Sangiovese/Syrah Blend 99

Nicknamed "the Cross," this blend is a cross of two traditionally unique varietals which are not really associated with each other. The result is a "hybrid" wine that has tremendous flavor and intensity. Crazy? May be. But it worked!

M. Chapoutier 2005 "La Bernadine" Châteauneuf-du-Pape, Rhône 115

If there were a "mother of all blends," then Châteauneuf-du-Pape may very well deserve the title. While the dominant varietal of red Châteauneuf is Grenache, by traditional the wine could include up to 13 different grapes (8 red and 5 white). Châteauneuf-du-Pape is firmly entwined with papal history, and thus their bottles feature the Papal symbol as an indication of this lineage.

Almaviva 2004 Red Blend Chile 165

When you combine two winemaking traditions, more than likely great things will happen. In this case it took the collaboration of the Rothschild Estate in Bordeaux and Concha y Toro in Chile. The result is a new creation using Cabernet and other Bordeaux varietals, and blend it with a local grape called Carmenère. The resulting taste profile is original.

Chateau Montrose 2004 St. Estèphe, Bordeaux 199

The world famous Bordeaux "blend" consists of five classic red varietals: Cabernet Sauvignon, Cabernet Franc, Merlot, Malbec, and Petit Verdot. While we now come to enjoy the complexity and refined character of wines from Bordeaux, this blend came about not because of its exceptional taste profile but rather, in the beginning winemakers in the region wanted to hedge their bets in the event bad weather or disease would hit. By farming different grapes with varying growing characteristics, their chances of a successful crop would increase, thus enabling them to make wine year in, year out.

Jonata "El Corazón" 2004 Red Blend Santa Ynez Valley 238

The history of winemaking in the U.S. is relatively young when compared to tradition-laden countries such as France. One advantage of farming grapes and making wine in newer regions is that winemakers are enabled to experiment and be creative. As a result new blends would emerge because of the lack of regulatory constraints. This one is a Syrah-driven blend with Cabernet, Merlot, Petit Verdot, Sangiovese, and a "dollop" of Sauvignon Blanc. Interesting side note: Jonata shares the same ownership with the legendary Screaming Eagle label.

Quintessa 2004 Red Blend Napa 265

To many new-world wineries the "Holy Grail" in vinting Cabernet is to create something reminiscent of Bordeaux. Their Cabernet-based blends are often referred to as a "red meritage" in America, and across the pond, the English preferred to use the term "claret." The "quin-factor" in this wine are the five different Bordeaux varietals grown in five different micro-climates.

Sassicaia 2004 (Super Tuscan) 375

The label Sassicaia may very well be the quintessential "wine rebel." Its founder had the foresight and especially the courage to plant Bordeaux varietals in Tuscany, a region that was dominated by the noble grape Sangiovese. People thought he was crazy, but his conviction led to the creation of a new category of Cabernet-based wine, which we now refer to as "Super Tuscans." Sassicaia is now an official Italian wine appellation.
